SPECIAL WORK MEETING

The Special Work Meeting began at 6:05 pm

The City Council, City Staff and Mayor discussed the Nicholls Park reconstruction. City Manager Green mentioned that he was planning on using the money from the cell tower rentals towards Nicholls Park. They proposed beginning construction the week after Founder's Day. They discussed lighting, security, landscaping, and cement work. City Manager Green mentioned applying for grants from Utah State Office of Outdoor Recreation. They discussed basketball courts and the grant money available through the Miller group. A possible stage and sound system for City events was discussed. City Manager Green also discussed needs for the Gailey Trail.

Bus stops in the City and possible cooperative agreements between the City and UTA were discussed.

The cemetery was discussed and it was determined that the next step in the process was to budget money for the needed engineering studies.

The needs for the Council Chambers were discussed and City Manager Green agreed to budget some money towards the upgrades. The City Council will determine how much to spend when the bids are available.

The City Council and City Staff discussed the fees for next year. The Storm Water and Water fees are scheduled to go up and the Council will need to determine if they follow the schedule or not.

The Mayor approached the City Council with the possibility of salary increases for the City Staff. There has not been a salary increase for two years. It was determined that the City Council would look at increasing the salaries and agreed that a long term plan would be the best option. Other cities do a cost of living increase of between 1.5% to 3% increases.
