US—89 SAFETY BARRIER PROJECT

UDOT will be making safety improvements along US-89 in Fruit Heights, Kaysville, and Layton. This project will construct a median barrier in the middle of the roadway and will be changing the access of some roads that connect to US-89. Starting just north of the Cherry Hill interchange and ending south of SR-193, each non-signalized direct access to US-89 will get one of three treatments:



1. Leave as is with a gap in the barrier.
2. Place barrier on US-89 to restrict turning movements at access to right in/right out.
3. Close the access by demolishing a portion of the access and placing fence across the access.

US-89 is planned to be an expressway facility in the future. The number of accesses on US-89 can create unsafe conditions for an expressway. In order to make the road safer, the number of accesses on US-89 needs to decrease. This median barrier project is a step toward meeting the vision of US-89.

UDOT is currently in the design phase of the process. Construction will take place in 2015.

HOUSE NUMBERS



Highly visible house numbers are important in cases of emergencies. Emergency vehicles are able to shorten response time when the house number can easily be seen and unobstructed by snow, vehicles, and debris. Please make sure that the numbers are large enough, and easily read, especially being illuminated at night.

MEASLES

Measles is a highly contagious, acute viral illness. It begins with a prodrome of fever, cough, coryza (runny nose), conjunctivitis (pink eye), lasting 2-4 days prior to rash onset. Measles can cause severe health complications, including pneumonia, encephalitis, and death. Measles is transmitted by contact with an infected person through coughing and sneezing; infected people are contagious from 4 days before their rash starts through 4 days afterwards. After an infected person leaves a location, the virus remains viable for up to 2 hours on surfaces and in the air.
