

IRRIGATION WATER RESTRICTIONS

Due to the extremely low water supply, Weber Basin Water Conservancy District's Board of Trustees has approved an immediate reduction of 20% to all agricultural irrigation water customer deliveries (including wholesale and individuals) and all wholesale secondary water deliveries. All outdoor (secondary) water users are to abide by the following restrictions:

- Water no more than 2 days per week from now until June 15th
- Water no more than 3 days per week from June 15th to Labor day (September 7th)
- Water no more than 2 days per week from September 7th to October 1st

The District does not allow outside watering between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. Given the extremity of this year's conditions, excessive watering of any type will not be allowed. These watering policies will be strongly enforced. District personnel will be patrolling service areas to ensure this policy is kept. Those who fail to comply with this policy will risk losing secondary water service for the remainder of the season and be subject to additional charges.

In an effort to help conserve this precious resource, the District will cease all irrigation and secondary water deliveries on October 1, 2015. This early shutoff will help conserve water for next year's needs.

With these reductions, we invite you to learn some basic landscape management principles that will assist you in maintaining your landscape with less water. Resources are available at www.weberbasin.com/conservation. Check out the resources and links to research and self-help information and apply these principles which will provide a landscape you enjoy with less water.

Weber Basin Water Conservancy District has committed, along with other members of the Governor's Water Conservation Team, to reduce per capita water use 25 percent by the year 2025. We encourage all water

SOLICITATION IN FRUIT HEIGHTS

There is a City Ordinance regarding residential solicitation.



All solicitors (except charitable organizations or school fund-raising) must apply for a license with the city. Once the application is approved, a picture identification card will be visibly worn at all times while soliciting in the city. Solicitation is allowed between 9A-9P by persons over the age of 18. Residents displaying "No Solicitation" signs are not to be disturbed by the solicitor by either knocking or ringing of the doorbell; however, they may leave literature at the door. Any person who violates any term of the City's Residential Solicitation Ordinance shall be guilty of a Class B Misdemeanor. If a solicitor is in violation of this ordinance, **please call the Davis County Sheriff's Department, 451-4150.**

Trash and Green Waste Cans

Please remember, trash and green waste receptacles are the responsibility of the residents. Put cans to the curb only when safe from winds close to pick-up times and bring in as soon as cans are emptied. Check with neighbors and/or search the area if your can has blown away. Replacement Cans from Robinson Waste are \$85.00 per can.

SEWER RATE INCREASE



Due to Central Davis Sewer District increasing sewer rates by \$2.00 beginning July 1st 2015, Fruit Heights City will increase sewer rates by \$2.00, making the full deduction amount of the sewer rate \$21.50 per month.
